All-powerful God, you are present in the whole universe and in the smallest of your creatures.


We thank you for being with us each day. Encourage us, we pray, in our struggle, for justice, love and peace.



Our new First Holy Communion and Confirmation Mass will be held on Thursday, 11<sup>th</sup> November at 6.30pm


## **LEARNING IN THE JUNIOR SYNDICATE - ROOM 12**
