



We made some very cute little sea creature friends, to remind us of another reason to care for our world! This was linked to our Inquiry around Kaitiakitanga - Guardianship and Protection.







As part of our Kaitiakitanga inquiry we are learning about how we can protect our ecosystem. We are busy designing a trap, bird feeder or bird house while we learn about the technology process.
